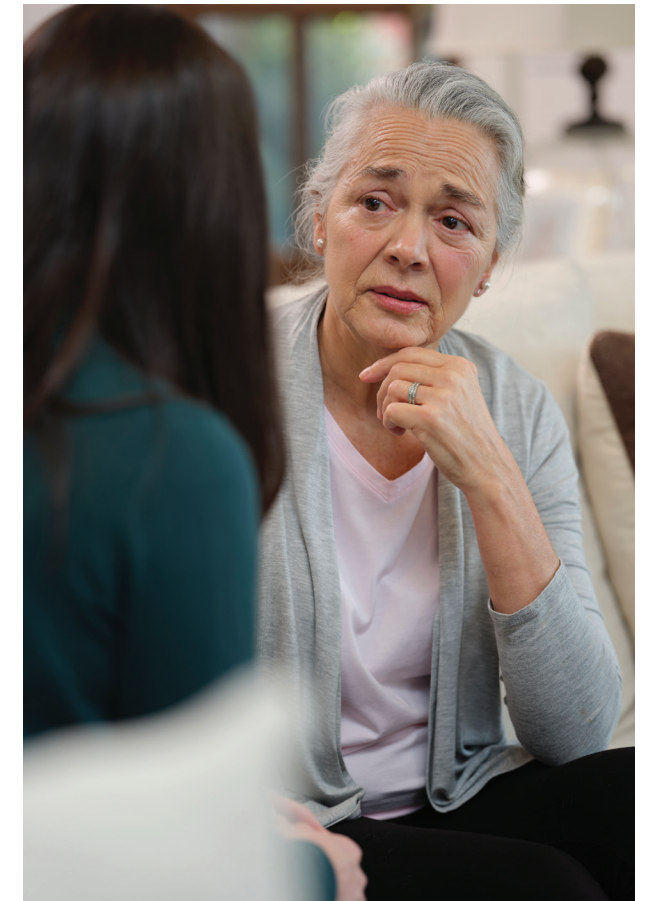

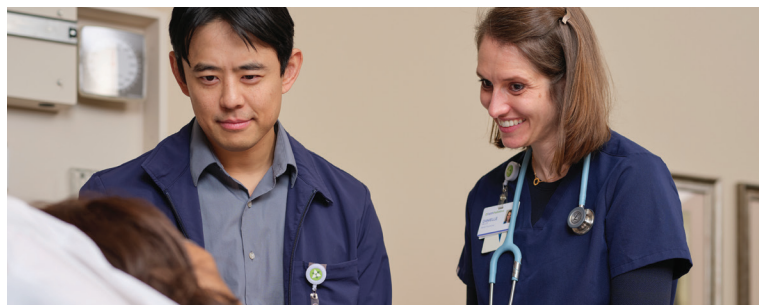
The Importance of Symptom Management
